#### Graduation Rate Improvement PlarUpdate

The University of Florida continues to improve graduation rates and refine our student success efforts. goab aretimely graduation for every student and reducing the gap in graduation rates for key subgroups.

UF Student Successiforts this year expanded higherfective programs in academic advising, success coaching, peer tutoring, and training peer mentors. The university identified students at risk for not graduating on time. We provided free tutoring in 38 cours #sat students most frequently repeat because of poor grades. The Gator Graduate Coaching program paired students eligible to graduate with a coach to remove all barriers to successful completion.

The UF Thrive Centeunites three existing programs that support first eneration, lowincome students to providea continuum of support from arly childhood tograduate school. The hrive Center connects The Center for Precollegiate Education and Training & Diversity Outreach program, the Office of Academic Support's UF Promise and U.S. DOE TRIO SSS prograths, d.S. DOE TRIO UF McNair Scholars program. We are submitting proposals to the U.S. DOE TRIO Upward Box part to host general, STEM, and veterans' 142 programs to complement our existing TRIO programs.
